Review Meeting of Tirur Coconut Processing Cluster, Kerala

Shri Arun, Joint Director, MoMSME, along with Mr. K. Surya Prakash Goud, a Faculty Member, nimsme, reviewed the progress and operations of the "Flavoured Coconut Milk and Virgin Coconut Oil Cluster" – an SFURTI cluster – in Tirur. The team interacted with SPV for the new initiatives undertaken by them for managing cluster, in addition to the existing SFURTI interventions. During the visit, the officials explored the Common Facility Centre (CFC) and examined the advanced machinery and production processes involved in coconut-based product manufacturing. They

the traditional coconut industry.


The officials interacted with Implementing agencies and artisans, highlighting the Ministry's commitment to the development and sustainability of SFURTI clusters.

Recent month, the Cluster introduced innovative packaging designs for a range

of jackfruit products, showcasing cluster commitment to product quality and market appeal. Initial efforts will focus on launching 5 flagship products, utilizing these new designs to enhance consumer engagement and brand recognition.

Additionally, the acquisition of the FSSAI license on 04 June 2024, marks a significant regulatory milestone for the cluster, ensuring



confidence in product safety and compliance to expand market presence. Proposals for dedicated storage facilities and robust power changeover systems underscore commitment to optimize production processes and ensuring uninterrupted operations.

O/o DC-MSME Officials Visited Mothkur Ikkath Handloom Cluster, Telangana

On 27 June 2024, ni-msme organized a visit to Mothkur Ikat Handloom Cluster for officials of Ministry of MSME to familiarize participants with ni-msme's activities and successful interventions in the cluster. This residential program, focusing on Bamboo Handicrafts and Skill Development, commenced on 18 June 2024, and will continue until 19 July2024, at the BRTC workshop in Chandrapur.

Ten artisans from the Wardha Cluster are participating in this training. Upon completion, these artisans will return to the Wardha bamboo cluster to impart their newly acquired skills to other artisans, thereby fostering skill development and enhancing the local bamboo industry.



KVIC Officials Visited SFURTI Cluster, Andhra Pradesh & Telangana

Dr. Greap, the Director of KVIC, and their Officials from KVIC recently visited SFURTI clusters in Kondapally, Pulivendhula, and L. Kota in Andhra Pradesh, and Ieeja in Telangana. Additionally, training sessions were conducted for Batch 1 and Batch 2 artisans, providing them with enhanced techniques for using various machines, with some receiving specialized training for specific equipment.

GMDIC also visited the cluster to observe its operations, interact with artisans, and extend his support for their betterment. Social media has facilitated an inflow of inquiries, which the artisans handle promptly and accurately, resulting in new orders through online inquiries.

Two student groups from Kangra and Pune visited cluster to learn about the ancestral art form, observe machine operations, and engage with artisans about their work and experiences. Embracing the era of e-commerce, HWIC held a meeting with global exporters from Alibaba to discuss registration plans, answer questions and explore opportunities to become global exporters of inlay products.

Medchal | "English News Times" | Medchal-Malkajigiri District Collector Gowtham Potru inspected the arrangements for construction of processing cluster and purchase and installation of vegetable and fruit processing machinery under the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (SFURTI) in Puduru village of Medchal district. The Collector inspected the arrangements for construction of vegetable and fruit processing cluster with the financial assistance of the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (NI-MSME) under the Traditional Industries Regeneration Scheme (SFURTI) at Adarsha Rythu Seva Cooperative Society in Puduru on Saturday, Collector Gowtham Potru said that about 190 tonnes of vegetables and fruits are wasted from the markets of Medchal district every year, to curb this waste, when the prices of vegetables fall to provide affordable prices to the farmers, they are cut and vegetables and cut fruits are used for packing, sauces, purees, powders and chutneys. He said that the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises will act as the nodal avency for this. The Collector inspected



the works of this cluster and gave appropriate advice and suggestions to the concerned authorities.
