India's first effort to include environmental education in formal education dates to the National Policy on Education in 1986.

The National Curriculum Framework in 2005 emphasized integrating environmental issues and recommended project-based learning. In 2016, the University Grants Commission (UGC) introduced a six-month compulsory course on environment studies for undergraduates from all disciplines.

To enhance climate literacy, the curriculum should focus on crucial aspects like Greenhouse Effects, Health Impacts, AdaptationStrategies, Biodiversity Conservation, Mitigation Measures, Empowering Students to Protect water bodies, wetlands, green spaces, Plant trees and increase forest cover.

The State of the Education Report for India 2023 emphasizes the role of education in addressing climate change challenges. By prioritizing climate literacy, India can prepare its citizens to combat environmental degradation and build a sustainable future.

In conclusion, fostering climate literacy among India's nearly 250 million school students are crucial. By doing so, we can boost India's fight against climate change and create a more informed and environmentally conscious society.

Secretary, Dept. of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India says that Education is a transformational tool in our fight against climate change – when we know better, we can do better. The UNESCO State of the Education Report for India is dedicated to the pivotal role of education in addressing climate change. District Collector Explores SFURTI Initiative for Poodur Vegetable & Fruit Processing Cluster

The Medchal Malkajgiri District Collectorate had an Interaction with SPV of Poodur cluster on 25 May 2024 to discuss the potential integration with the SFURTI initiative.

These initiatives are expected to enhance the cluster's appeal and contribute to its economic growth.

MoMSME Reviews SFURTI Clusters in Kerala

Sura Prakash Goud, Faculty Member of **ni-msme**, reviewed the progress and operations of "Flavoured Coconut Milk and Virgin Coconut Oil Cluster" in Tirur. The officials observed the construction of the CFC and the machinery installed in the CFC. They interacted with SPV members regarding the benefits of soft interventions as well as the present scenario.
